Dear Mr. C.

At its hearing on Tuesday, June 29, 1976 the University Tribunal considered the following charge against you:

'That in April, 1976 you submitted a term paper in SOC 216 which you represented as your own work but which was in fact the work of another with intent to deceive within the meaning of Section 3.1(a)(ii) of the Academic Code of Behaviour.'

In accordance with Section 65 of the Rules of Procedure of the University of Toronto Disciplinary Structure, I am writing to formally advise you of the decision of the Local Branch of the Trial Division of the University Tribunal with respect to this charge.

The jury found you to be guilty of the charge and has imposed the following sanction:

'The jury has decided to agree with the University's sanction of suspension for twelve months ... We have decided that the suspension for plagiarism be recorded on his transcript:

- 1) Until he receives a degree from the University of Toronto, or
- 2) For three years, whichever occurs first.'
