Dear Mr. W.

At its hearing on Monday, July 14, 1980 the Local Branch of the Trial Division of the University Tribunal considered the following charge against you:

• that in HPS 412Y:

- (i) you used without acknowledgment a secondary source on a short exercise paper;
- (ii) you included major portions from a secondary source without acknowledgment in the final paper.

I am writing to formally advise you of the decision of the Tribunal with respect to the two charges to which you pleaded guilty. In view of your plea the jurors ordered that the following sanctions be imposed:

- 1) zero in HPS 412Y;
- 2) suspension from attendance at all courses from February 28, 1980 until January 1, 1981. This means that all courses not completed on February 28, 1980, except for HPS 412Y in which a zero is to be entered on your transcript, will be deleted from your academic record;
- 3) a record of these sanctions to be recorded on your transcript until April 30, 1981.
